Some Second Comber Prayers

- Pray for all of our children and young people and their parents as they adjust to this challenging situation.
- Pray for patience and understanding as parents deal with home schooling and children adapt to different ways of learning without the discipline of school and the presence of their classmates.
- Remember too, the teachers, who are working differently to provide feedback and encouragement to their classes. Remember those teachers who are still

going into School on a rotational basis to help care of the children of key workers. Pray for their health and well being and that of their families.

- Thank God for technology and opportunities to reach out and share God's word with the children in new ways. Pray that many will access the resources being made available through our Google Classroom so that they will learn about the importance of God's Armour.
- Remember especially those young people who have finished school, not in the way in which they would have hoped or wished. Pray that they will be strong mentally and continue to study and strive towards their goal whether it be University entrance, College entrance or employment. We know how much they will miss their face to face meetings with their friends. Pray that they will know support and friendship through our Church family and our social media interactions.
- Pray for the members of the LIFE team: -'Inspire us with your ideas and fresh ways to take forward Women's Ministry. Help us to make plans in faith and by your spiritual guidance.'
- Pray that women will develop a deeper desire to grow in spiritual maturity. Pray for opportunities for women to study Gods Word together.
